

## RISK + PROTECTIVE FACTORS

Examples of Risk and protective factors associated with the development of drug or alcohol problems

RISK	PROTECTIVE FACTORS
COMMUNITY LEVEL	
High availability of drugs in a neighbourhood.	Co-operation and cohesion within the community
Little stability or cohesion in community	Stability and connection of the community population
Unstable housing or lots of transitions	Safe and secure housing
Poverty-disadvantaged neighbourhoods	Good relationship with adult or adults outside the family
	Sense of belonging to a community
SCHOOL LEVEL	
Disconnection (or at risk) from School	A sense of belonging at school
Not achieving at school	Positive achievements at school (not just academic)
Suspension or expulsion	academic)
Transitions between many schools	Attendance at preschool education
Not fitting in at school	
Parents not valuing school	
FAMILY LEVEL	
Family history of problem AOD use	A sense of belonging or connectedness to family
Family conflict	Proactive family problem solving
Harsh or inconsistent parenting	Family rituals/celebrations held and
Marital conflict	maintained
	A warm relationship even with one parent
INDIVIDUAL/PEER LEVEL	
Alienation/rebelliousness	Even temperament
Hyperactivity/impulse control difficulties	Good social skills
Friendship groups where drug use is encouraged or normal.	Work success during adolescence
Friends who engage in problem behaviours	<ul> <li>Connection with some friends who don't use drugs or alcohol</li> </ul>
Positive attitudes towards using drugs	Different sets of friendship groups
Using drugs at an early age	- Different sets of mendship groups
